#### COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

#### Responses to Questions Asked of Administration - 63 Woodbridge Avenue

Chair Kehoe stated that the owner of the house at 63 Woodbridge Avenue is current on his property taxes and has secured the house so that there is no danger of collapse or

hazard to the surrounding properties. As such, the property is in compliance with the town's Property Maintenance Code.

#### Disposition of Town-owned Property Other Than Real Estate - Used Furniture

Chair Kehoe announced that, pursuant to §10-3(c) of the town's Code of Ordinances, the Administration is notifying the Town Council that old furniture from Raymond Library and other locations will be disposed of through public auction.

#### East Hartford Housing Authority (EHHA) Update

<u>Deb Bouchard</u>, Executive Director, announced that present in the Chamber were <u>Robert Keating</u>, Chair of the EHHA's Board of Commissioners, <u>John Carella</u>, member of the Board of Commissioners, and <u>Kelly McDermott</u>, Senior Manager of Planning and Modernization.

Ms. Bouchard reported that the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) just recently acknowledged that the EHHA exited out of troubled status. She went on to summarize the accomplishments of EHHA: (1) the negotiation of the sale of King Court; (2) EHHA's new website; (3) a 20-year HUD rent subsidy contract for Veterans Terrace; (4) new policies and trained staff on various programs; (5) monitoring their budget more tightly; (6) reduced expenses through collective bargaining agreements on self-insuring dental coverage and healthcare programs.

Ms. Bouchard stated that the anticipated closing for the sale of King Court is early April 2014 with a selling price of \$3,200,000. The proceeds from the sale of King Court – after repayment of obligated funds – will be split between the State of Connecticut and the Town of East Hartford.

#### East Hartford Board of Education: Medical Analysis Presentation

Michael Walsh, Finance Director, summarized the reasons why this presentation is necessary – higher medical costs in the current fiscal year will extend into the upcoming budget year. Since the Medical Reserve is depleted, Mr. Walsh stated that more financial resources need to be embedded in the upcoming budget to more closely match the expected medical costs.

<u>Arch Henderson</u>, <u>Todd Goodall</u>, and <u>Deb Testa</u>, representatives from Lockton, the town's outside consultant for the town's and Board of Education's medical accounts, presented charts and graphs concerning the upswing in the medical claims experienced by both the town and the Board. Most of the increase is attributed to the rise of cancer cases and the prescription drugs to combat chronic illnesses like diabetes.

Grocery Delivery Grant (NCAAA)

The North Central Area Agency on Aging (NCAAA) is a regional agency which grants federal dollars to programs benefiting the older adult population. They have granted East Hartford various amounts for many senior citizen programs since 1992. This year we intend to apply for \$3,000 to continue funding the Grocery Delivery Program. The grant application deadline is March 14, 2014 for the program year which begins on October 1, 2014.

The Grocery Delivery Program has operated for the past nine years by providing homebound residents with grocery delivery service. Seniors pay for their groceries, and the grant funding pays for the cost of the delivery. Approximately 570 deliveries will be provided to East Hartford seniors if the full amount of our request is approved. Matching funds will be supported by Town of East Hartford Grocery Assistance account (S4923).


