East Hartford to Offer Low-Cost Rabies Clinic

East Hartford, CT – Mayor Marcia A. Leclerc is pleased to announce that the East Hartford Town Clerk's Office will sponsor a low-cost Rabies Clinic on Saturday, May 18, 2019, from 12 pm-2 pm at the rear of Firehouse No. 1, located at 726 Main Street. This clinic is presented in partnership with Dr. Wilfredo Barrios, Veterinarian of the East Hartford Animal Clinic and in cooperation with the Connecticut Veterinary Medical Association.

The clinic is open to both dogs and cats, and they must be appropriately leashed or crated, respectively. The clinic is open to all, regardless of residency. **The fee is \$20 cash only**. One pet may be vaccinated at no charge for owners who show their State Public Assistance Identification Card.

The clinic will issue a three-year rabies vaccination to pets with a valid rabies certificate or a dog license showing **prior vaccination.** The one-year vaccine will be given to all other pets. Valid license tags are not a sufficient proof to qualify for the three-year vaccination.

The Low Cost Rabies Vaccination Clinic will be held on **Saturday, May 18, 2019 from 12:00 (noon) to 2:00 p.m.** in the rear of Firehouse Number 1, located next to Town Hall at 726 Main Street, East Hartford.

Dogs must be on leashes and cats must be in carriers. There are no residency requirements.

The fee is \$20 cash only. One pet may be vaccinated at no charge for owners who show their State Public Assistance Identification Card.
