COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

Presentation by the MDC: Monthly Billing

Robert Constable, Director of Finance for The Metropolitan District, and <u>Julie McLaughlin</u>, Communications Administrator, briefed the Council on the new monthly billing cycle which will take effect January 2017, payable in February 2017. There will be an insert in the January bill (which covers water usage for the last quarter of 2016) as well as a separate mailing to all MDC customers explaining the monthly billing cycle. MDC's goal is to implement online payments – eBilling – which will help keep costs down.

Presentation by Finance Director Mike Walsh - Orphan Properties

Mike Walsh reviewed the process of the town's annual tax lien sale with the Council. The 17 properties identified on the delinquency list is the result of no bids on these particular properties. These parcels are designated as delinquent, with no easy or clear way to collect outstanding taxes. The Administration's goal with these properties is to create productive parcels that can be added to the grand list.

Purchasing Department: §10-10(b) of the Code of Ordinances re: Not Accepting the Lowest Bid for Custodial Services for Town Hall and the Public Safety Complex

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> announced that the low bidder for custodial services – S. J. Services Inc. – withdrew their bid due to an error in estimating the required union wages. PROPOSED HEALTH DEPARTMENT FEES SCHEDULE

FOOD SERVICE FEES

FOR RESTAURANTS, CATERERS, GROCERY STORES AND ITINERANT VENDORS:

JUSTIFICATION

In determining this new schedule, we elected not to use a comparative analysis of other Connecticut municipalities and health districts, as many of them are in the process of updating their fee schedules — making points of reference a moving target. Two of the most recent municipal and district schedules we did find however, were Darien (FY 2016) and the Pomperaug Health District (FY 2017). Their schedules are similar to our proposed schedule. We chose, rather, to employ an empirical, defensible and more accurate determination based upon the actual number of employee hours expended during the conduct of each type of inspection, and factors including administrative time, inflation since the last fee update in 2010 and the rate of revisits resulting from compliance issues.

- **An assessment parameter for Travel Time (.5 hrs. per inspection) was not included in the fees calculations. HACCP (Hazardous Analysis of Critical Control Points) type of inspections are being promulgated by the State Department of Public Health they consume the better part of a workday and have not been factored into this fee restructuring. Also, DPH is in the process of mandating to Local

Health Departments the enforcement of the Federal Food Service Inspection Code, which entails a more involved, lengthier inspection process. This was not factored into our fees calculations at this time.

Section 10-52. Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.

- (a) There is established a Retiree Benefit Trust Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide funds to meet long-term obligations of the Town of East Hartford regarding health benefits provided to retired town employees in accordance with provisions for such benefits contained in any agreement between town employees and the Town of East Hartford.
- (b) Income to such fund shall include any amounts appropriated to such fund by the town council or as provided in this subsection and any return on investments of such funds. If, at the close of any fiscal year, the undesignated reserve fund for the town exceeds [eight] ten percent of the total budget appropriation for such fiscal year, the budget surplus in such fiscal year, as verified by the town auditors, shall be appropriated to the Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.
- (c) Expenses of such fund shall include those expenses necessary for the maintenance and administration of the fund, including but not limited to actuary and consulting fees. 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
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

ARTICLE 4. PATRIOTIC COMMISSION.

Sec. 14-22. Established; Composition.

- a) There is established a Patriotic Commission of nine (9) members representing the public-atlarge. Effective: 9/19/84
- b) There may be up to six (6) additional positions for representatives of any six (6) civic, fraternal, business, or religious organizations. Effective: 9/19/84
- c) There shall be no more than one (1) representative from any single organization mentioned above. Effective: 9/19/84

Sec. 14-23. Appointment and Terms of Members.

- a) Initially, appointments shall be two (2) members for a term of one (1) year; two (2) members for a term of two (2) years; and three (3) members for a term of three (3) years. After initial terms expire, subsequent terms will each be for a three (3) year period.
- b) Associate members, members appointed by the Commission for special projects, shall have no voting privileges. There shall be no limit to the number of associate members and terms of associate members shall expire on the first day of December of each year. Effective: 1/14/81
- c) The terms of each civic, fraternal, business, or religious representative shall expire on the first day of December of each year. Effective: 9/19/84

Sec. 14-24. Duties.

The Patriotic Commission shall have the authority and responsibility to study and conduct activities related to national and state holidays, town celebrations, etc. The Commission shall promote the town image and make recommendations to the Mayor and Council regarding the arrangements, supervision, plan and conduct of such activities, and shall have the authority and responsibility to conduct all approved activities.
