Attached please find a list of interdepartmental transfers as well as a Resolution Concerning a Supplemental Budget Appropriation to be approved by the Town Council by June 30, 2019 to allow the town to end the fiscal year "in the black" by department.

General Fund - Transfers To:

<u>Town Clerk - \$12k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for Election Day expenses incurred for both an unbudgeted Primary and Special Election held during the fiscal year.

<u>Human Resources - \$11k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for the retirement related payout of the shared HR/Corp. Counsel Secretary as well as HR consultant related employee testing.

<u>Employee Benefits - Severance - \$310k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for retirement severance paid predominately to a variety of retiring firefighters, some who entered DROP.

<u>Health - \$17k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for additional mosquito spraying due to the extraordinary wet spring.

<u>Contingency Reserve - \$11k</u>: This transfer will provide funding for Election Day expenses due to both a Primary and Special Election – funds sent to Registrar of Voters already.

General Fund - Transfers From:

<u>Police - \$300k:</u> This transfer is available due to lower expenditures throughout the department predominately in Permanent Services due to vacant positions.

<u>Parks and Rec. - \$61k</u>: This transfer is available due to lower expenditures throughout the department.

RESOLUTION CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION AND FUND BALANCE TRANSFER TO FUND A YEAR-END DEFICIT IN THE GENERAL FUND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2019

WHEREAS, the Town of East Hartford has experienced higher than budgeted costs in the Information Technology line for unplanned software and infrastructure needs, in the Assessor's Department for legal costs to defend the Pratt revaluation lawsuit, in the Fire Department Overtime, Holiday, and Permanent Services accounts as a result of vacancies, minimum staffing provisions in the collectively bargained labor agreement, and pending retirements, and in a variety of Public Works accounts for tank removal, overtime, utility costs, rising vehicle maintenance, higher refuse disposal fees due to a MIRA mid-year turbine breakdown, as well as funding for unbudgeted capital projects at the Community Cultural Center and Second North School, and

WHEREAS, these expenses have been or will be paid from the Town's General Fund by June 30, 2019, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the aforementioned, it is necessary for the Town of East Hartford to set aside additional budget contributions to fund a projected General Fund deficit in fiscal year 2018-19.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the East Hartford Town Council does hereby approve this Supplemental Budget Appropriation of funds in the amount of \$2,000,000 from the Town's Undesignated Fund Balance for the purpose of funding a fiscal year 2018-19 deficit as listed below and does hereby amend the current 2018-19 fiscal year Operating Budget to reflect the attached Supplemental Revenue Appropriation and Expenditure Appropriation.

Per Mike's request for clarification on any overspending we have had the following non-planned expenditures from the IT department in FY 2019.

Total Amount of unexpected overage: \$176,330.73

Office 365 was driven by a requirement to move to modern Office software and provide training to the Town as we pushed forward into Windows 10. Total investment year 1, unplanned was \$67,932.

The Public Safety Complex Camera and Access Control system was driven unexpectedly due to failures on cameras in critical areas of the building, possibly extending risk to the Town in the form of legal challenges. The Access Control system (locks) has been upgraded as much as possible and was original to the building construction, making it 15 years old and experiencing hardware failures. Information Technology was engaged by Facilities to determine steps and leveraged a vendor's expertise to identify the most impactful option as system replacement. The resulting bill to prevent critical failure was \$108,398.73 and swapping cameras on the verge of failure. 58 Cameras and one access control system that provides controlled access to 32 doors had to be swapped or integrated to protect the security of the Public Safety Complex. Day 2 expenses should return to the Department of Facilities, who has had responsibility of system maintenance and replacement budgeting since the building was constructed.

Additional planned expenditures include the replacement of the town-wide phone system comprised of around 550 phones, 5 control units to operate the phones and connect with the outside world, 1 voicemail system and 1 call accounting and reporting product.

Information Technologies funds will cover the planned asbestos abatement of the Chief Information Officers suite, which also houses a GIS analyst, using funds found through proactive swaps on desktop hardware which have resulted in savings from the 62326 line items.

Folks -

Here's the explanation of how the budget process over a few years approved a higher level of capital projects using LOCIP funding than the level of funding provided by the State.

Generally speaking, the Town budget over allocated about a year's worth of State LOCIP funding due primarily to the State reporting out a FY 17 allocation (see page one of the attached PDF) but due to pressure on the State bond cap, not paying that out until FY 18 which the Town budget captured as a higher allocation (see page two of the attached PDF).

The transfer of surplus from other completed LOCIP projects also partially masked the issue until now.

The solution is to find a different funding source for the PBX phone system (\$306,000) so I will attempt to run it through the books using June 30th transfers.

The Board of Education with the approval of the Town Council can transfer up to 1% of its current operating budget to the Town's Capital Reserve account. REASON: To approve the transfer of year end, general budget fund balance to the Town of East Hartford's Reserve Fund for building improvements. With the Board's approval, funds will be set aside from year end balances and placed within the Town's "Reserve Fund" in accordance with Section 10-38 Town Code Ordinance. This section of the Town Ordinance allows the Board of Education to set capital and non-recurring expenditures, in this Reserve Fund for use under the jurisdiction of the Board of Education. The Town Council must approve the use of these funds for building improvements.

BACKGROUND: East Hartford Public Schools has a major projects planned for building improvements and technology infrastructure. The Capital Reserve Fund will be used as the funding source for the following building and technology improvement projects.

A year end fund balance by state statute cannot exceed 1.0% of the current year adopted budget or \$906,914. The school administration recommends the transfer of any remaining general budget funds, up to this amount, into the Town's Capital Reserve Fund. The amount of the general budget funds available to be transferred is determined at the close of the fiscal year. A memo listing the building and technology infrastructure projects to be completed is included with this agenda item.

ACCOUNT AFFECTED BY TRANSACTION: There is no impact on the general budget. Funding will come from the accumulation of year end balances from all general budget accounts.

end of any fiscal year shall be put into the Town's account, unless provisions are made to utilize a surplus in the forthcoming fiscal year. Upon approval by Council, other funds may be transferred into or appropriated for the Town account, subject to the limitations set forth in Sections 7-361 and 7-367 of the General Statutes.

Sec. 10-36. Investment of Fund.

The Treasurer may, from time to time, invest in securities which are legal investments for savings banks, such portion of such funds as in his or her opinion is advisable; provided not less than fifty percent of the total amount invested shall be invested in the stock or bonds or interest-bearing notes or obligations of the United States, or those to which the faith of the United States is pledged to provide the payment of the principal and interest, including the bonds of the District of Columbia. In making investments of reserve funds, the Treasurer shall give preference to financial institutions located within the town, unless such preference would result in materially lower investment rates. Notwithstanding the above, no funds shall be invested in any businesses which conduct business in South Africa until and unless the Council declares that apartheid has ended. Before investing any funds contained in the Board of Education account, the Treasurer shall consult with the Board to insure that such funds have the liquidity desired by the Board.

Sec. 10-37. Report of Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall annually submit a complete and detailed report of the condition of such fund to the Finance Director, Mayor, Council, and Board of Education, and such report shall be made a part of the Annual Report of the Town.

Sec. 10-38. Use of Funds.

Upon the recommendation of the Finance Director and the Mayor, and approval by the legislative body, any part of such funds may be used for capital and nonrecurring expenditures, but such use shall be restricted to the financing of all or part of the planning, construction, reconstruction or acquisition of any specific capital improvement or the acquisition of any specific item of equipment. All funds contained in the Board of Education's account shall be reserved for capital and nonrecurring expenditures for educational purposes determined by the Board. Upon request of the Board, and certification that funds are to be used for such educational purposes, the Finance Director and the Mayor shall recommend, and the Council shall approve, release of such funds, up to the amount then included in the Board account. Upon the approval of any such expenditure, an appropriation shall be set up, plainly designated for the project or acquisition for which it has been authorized, and such unexpended appropriation may be continued until such project or acquisition is completed. Any unexpended portion of such appropriation remaining after such completion shall revert to the reserve account from which the appropriation was taken.

Sec. 10-39. Appropriation When Reserve Fund Insufficient.

Town Council Approval of the Sale of Individual Tax Liens

At the April 2, 2019 Town Council Meeting, a motion was approved by the Town Council as it relates to tax liens the town is interested in selling including the following provisions:

- The Collector of Revenue shall notify the record owner of each property subject to a lien that is to be included in the tax lien sale, by certified mail, that the lien is being included in the request for proposal and invitation to bid, and that the owner should contact the Town immediately to pay the taxes or seek a payment plan if they wish to keep the Town's tax liens on their property from being sold;
- 2. In order to qualify for a payment plan, the property owner must meet the following three criteria:
 - They must remit 25% of the outstanding amount due
 - They cannot have defaulted on a prior payment arrangement
 - Their property must not have active property code violations;
- 3. The letters from the Collector of Revenue to each property owner shall notify the property owner that the purchaser of the tax lien on their property shall have the right to foreclose on that property; and
- 4. The Administration shall return to the Town Council with the results of the request for proposal and that the proposal for each tax lien must be approved by the Town Council before it is sold.

With respect to the aforementioned motion, having satisfied the conditions of the process articulated by the Town Council and now need to return to the Town Council to seek approval to sell tax liens where the bids received by the Town through the request for proposal (RFP) process were satisfactory.

Know that the initial list acted on by the Town Council on February 15, 2019 totaled 113 properties with \$2,168,953.18 due to the town in delinquent taxes.

As of today, 10 properties did not receive a bid while 61 properties either paid in full or entered into a payment plan with the town leaving 42 properties totaling \$620,876.46 set to go to lien sale.

Based on the bids received (and attached), we are requesting these 42 properties be sold to the following bidders:

Bidder # 1	FIG Capital Investments, LLC	37 bids totaling	\$539,135.10
Bidder # 2	RTLF-CT, LLC	3 bids totaling	\$ 50,486.05
Bidder # 3	60 Wooster, LLC	1 bid totaling	\$ 50,000.00

It should be noted that all bids being recommended for approval were higher than the tax and interest due to the town producing a premium of \$44,212.63.

Once these liens are sold, the property owner will have the opportunity to redeem these liens from the new owner based on a time period established by Connecticut General Statutes.



The Inspections and Permits Department states that permits and inspections may be required for temporary installations.

The Office of Corporation Counsel states it has no issues with this application and that the applicant will need to work with the Parks & Recreation Department to execute a License Agreement with the Town for the use of Town roads and facilities.

The Fire Department approves the application as submitted and indicates there are no anticipated costs to their Department.

The Health and Parks & Recreation Departments approve the application as submitted and state there are no anticipated costs to their Departments.

The Public Works Department approves the application as submitted and states there are no anticipated costs to their Department.

The **Police Department** conducted a review of the application and the following comments/recommendations are made:

 There will be significant detours for several hours. Traffic on the adjacent streets can be maintained with a near-normal flow of traffic. Police manpower required for these events exceeds the Department's normal Patrol Complement and overtime hiring will be necessary. As an event that is not Town-sponsored, this expense will have to be borne by the applicant. The <u>anticipated</u> cost to the Department for this event is \$1,878.08 which includes a 1% contractual raise.




