



MISSION










FD Revenue

- Utilized a statewide entry-level testing initiative to hire four new firefighter/paramedics
- Distributed and installed over 300 smoke detectors in the community.
- No civilian fire fatalities



> PLANNED CAPITAL EXPENSE FY 2020

- NCORPORATED 1783
- The Capital Budget includes funding for three (3) light fleet vehicles. Recently, the department has removed from service several vehicles. Their specific condition is noted below. Each of the vehicles suffered from mechanical and corrosion damage. The repair of that damage far exceeded the value of the vehicle.
- Former C-7 (EMS) rust, transmission issues, 163,750 miles
- Former C-9 (Emergency Management), rust, failed rear axle, 120,357 miles
- Apparatus Repair/ Alarm Division shared car: failed rear axle, rust, sent to auction
- Back-up shift commander car: rust, sent to auction
