



> PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS



The Public Safety Communications Center is the main answering point for all Police, Fire and Emergency Medical calls for service within the Town of East Hartford. The Center is staffed 24 hours a day on 365 days of the year.

Public Safety Communications Staffing:

- 1 Sworn Police Lieutenant & 4 Supervisors
- 19 Telecommunicators

Public Safety Communications Statistics:

- 26,221 Calls for Police Service
- 7,787 Calls for Fire & Fire EMD
- 1,945 Calls for Emergency Medical Service
- 2020 Total Calls for Service 35,953


Drug Testing

Police Accountability Bill

1-4 & 15 Police Officer Certification and Decertification

Bill requires police officers to pass a drug test every three years as a condition of their POSTC recertification

42 officers per year x \$170 per test = \$7,140 per year





> NEW INITIATIVES


Behavioral Health Assessment

Police Accountability Bill

3 & 15-16 Behavioral Health Assessment for Police Officers

Bill requires police officers to submit to a behavioral health assessment every five years.

20 officers per year x \$250 per assessment = \$5,000





> NEW INITIATIVES

Dashboard Cameras

Police Accountability Bill 40 Dashboard Cameras

Bill requires each law enforcement unit to use dashboard cameras in each Patrol vehicle.

40 Patrol vehicles x \$1548 per vehicle = \$61,920
