





CONNECTICUT GENERAL STATUTES SECTION 10-19M



Mandated by Connecticut General Statue section 10-19m, a Youth Service Bureau (YSB) is an agency operated directly by one or more municipalities that is designed for planning, evaluation, coordination, and implementation of a network of resources and opportunities for children, youth, and their families. In addition, YSBs are responsible for the provision of services and programs for all youth to develop positively and to function as responsible members of their communities.



COUNSELING SERVICES Using Telehealth Technology



- The Department employs part-time contractual counseling staff composed of 5 Master's-level Marriage & Family therapists, 2 -Master's-level Social Workers. In addition there are 7 master's level (MFT & MSW) interns.
- Hours range from late afternoons and evenings throughout the year, as well as Saturdays between the hours of 9:00 AM 1 PM.

The counseling staff and interns were quickly able to provide virtual, remote, online telehealth services





Suicide Prevention: "Signs of Suicide Curriculum"


SOS is an evidence-based suicide prevention program for Middle School and High School students.

"Designed for students in grades 6-8, SOS Signs of Suicide for middle school teaches students how to identify the signs of depression and suicide in themselves and their peers"

6-7-8th Graders at Sunset Ridge School received the program virtually in their classrooms






Let's Talk COVID
