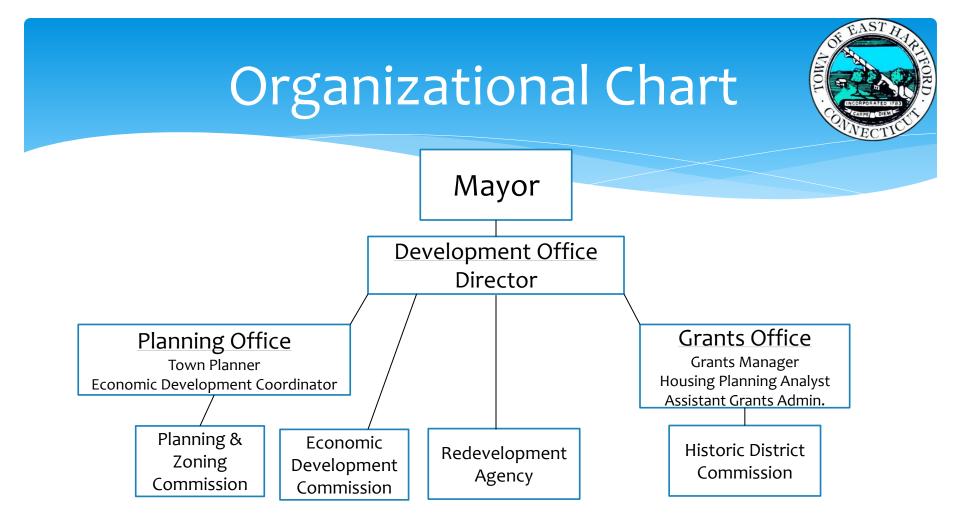

# FY 2017 Savings



The Department is achieving savings in the current 2016-2017 fiscal year due to a change in the Assistant Grants Administrator position and by deciding not to pay dues to MetroHartford Alliance or the Connecticut River Valley Chamber of Commerce due to the Town's current economic situation.

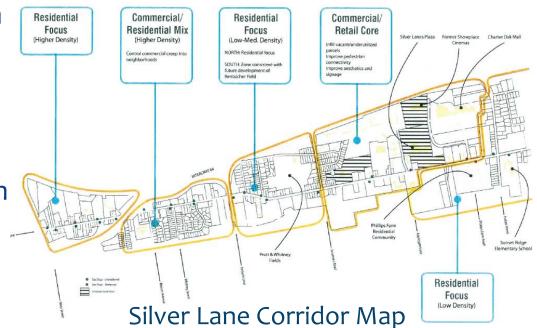




## Silver Lane

# Working Cities Challenge











Economic



- Program administered by the Federal **Reserve Bank of Boston**
- Aimed at incentivizing cross-sector collaboration to improve the lives of lowincome residents
- Core elements include community engagement and systems change.
- Our focus is the Silver Lane Neighborhood. \*
- We could receive a \$15,000 planning grant in March and a three-year implementation prize of up to \$500,000 in January of 2018.

## Commercial Facade Improvement Program



- \* The Town will fund 100% of the first \$2,000 and 75% of costs above \$2,000 up to a total Town contribution of \$50,000
- \* Priority is given to buildings downtown on Main Street between the railroad overpass and the I-84 overpass

- Streamlined the application process and implemented digital submission using iPads to reduce the cost of doing business in East Hartford
- Working on campus zoning district (Design Development District 3) to facilitate comprehensive redevelopment around Goodwin College

## **Redevelopment Agency**

- Carries out redevelopment activities authorized by the CT General Statutes
- Currently working on Main and on Burnside; Future opportunities for Silver Lane
- Completed facade renovation at Chuck's Automotive
- Will begin demolition of Daley Court with DECD grant funding

- \* Grants Manager position 90% Town-funded
- \* Assistant Grants Admin., Housing Planning Analyst salaries 100% paid by CDBG
- \* Grants Manager funded 10% through CDBG
- \* CDBG Year 42 (2016-17) Allocation is \$498,058
- \* List of all active grants total \$6,138,802
