


Largest Police Agency East of the Connecticut River




Protective Safety Equipment

Public Safety Communications

The Public Safety Communications Center is the main answering point for all Police, Fire and Emergency Medical calls for service within the Town of East Hartford. Our Communications Center is the largest Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) East of the CT River. The Center is staffed 24 hours a day on 365 days of the year.

Public Safety Communications Staffing:

- 1 Sworn Police Lieutenant & 3 Supervisors
- 19 Telecommunicators

Public Safety Communications Statistics:

- 33,811 Calls for Police Service
- 1,717 calls for Fire Service
- 8,831 Calls for Emergency Medical Service
- 2016 Total Calls for Service 44,359

New Initiative Body Worn Cameras

EHPD is committed to the belief that on-officer audio/video is an important and valuable tool for law enforcement. The use of on-officer video is expected to result in greater transparency, more effective prosecution, and improved protection against false allegations of excessive use of force, misconduct or racial profiling.

Taser / Axon – 75 Body Worn Camera (every uniformed officer)

- ☐ 5 year Officer Safety Program
- ☐ New cameras initial issue, 2 ½ years & 5 years
- ☐ New Taser with every camera purchased
- ☐ Unlimited camera device storage
- \$577,300 for five year contract (\$115,460 per year)
