




Mayor's Office

- Director of Emergency Management
- Ensures that all laws and ordinances are faithfully executed
- Prepares and submits to the Council an annual budget
- Interacts with the general public, State and Federal Agencies
- The Mayor's office serves as a "clearing house" facilitating immediate responses to requests for information and assistance, as well as the satisfactory resolution of complaints
