### COMMUNICATIONS AND PETITIONS

### Responses to Questions Asked of Administration - January 6th Meeting

From Tim Bockus, Public Works Director:

Brine Machine: The brine truck has proven itself to be a valuable asset in our winter storm fighting operations. This tool allows us to pretreat roadway surfaces well in advance of oncoming storms mostly during normal workday hours when pavement temperatures are warmer, resulting in overtime avoidance. It also allows us to reduce our salt usage since the brine stays where we place it unlike solid salt which tends to scatter when placed and when subjected to higher traffic volumes. For the most part, the brine is placed bidirectionally requiring a pass in each direction on a road. There are some instances where the brine is placed at night or when traffic is minimal that certain roads can be treated with a single pass. The discharge nozzles are adjustable and allow for variations in the spray pattern. The brine truck does have its limitation however. Consideration must be given to roadway surface temperatures and storm configuration before the brine will be used. So far this season, we have not used the truck since neither of the two recent storms have warranted the use of the brine. The first storm occurred during leaf collection when the truck was fitted for leaf collection and the latest involved significant rainfall which would have diluted and washed the brine from the surface.

LED Streetlights: The LED streetlights in the Mayberry Village area were installed during the first week of December. I have been through the area since their installation and noted a significant improvement to the lighting. I took especial note of the consistent coverage along the roadways with very little "dark spots" present which were prevalent with the previous high pressure sodium fixtures. Also, I was impressed with the color rendering of the new LED which allowed me to distinguish colors. For example, I could easily recognize a blue car from a green car or a silver car from a white car. I would like to emphasize that LEDs are highly directional and concentrate more of the light where it is intended. If there was a concern with diminished peripheral lighting, it could be that the light is now better kept to the roadway reducing lost light, typical of the old high pressure sodium fixtures, onto front yards. More specific location information would be necessary to pursue the complaint.

Goodwin College is in the final stages of completing a soil remediation at 9 Riverside Drive (Connecticut River Academy) and has asked the Town to subordinate its sidewalk and drainage easements at the site to comply with an Environmental Land Use Restriction (ELUR) they must enter into with DEEP.

The ELUR agreement between Goodwin College and DEEP will limit activities at the site that may compromise contaminated soil on the property that has been 'capped' during the soil remediation process. In subordinating our sidewalk and drainage easements at the site maintenance work will be allowed provided that the cap is repaired and contaminated soil is not released. Under the sidewalk easement Goodwin College will be responsible for all maintenance and repairs, and will be responsible for any additional incurred costs to the Town during repairs or maintenance on the drainage easements when adhering to the ELUR.

I ask that the Town Council execute the Subordination Agreement in which the Town of East Hartford subordinates its interests in the sidewalk and drainage easements at 9 Riverside Drive to the terms of an Environmental Land Use Restriction between Goodwin College and the Commissioner of Environmental Protection of the State of Connecticut. Attached is additional documentation including the ELUR provided by Assistant Corporation Counsel, Richard Gentile.

Connecticut River Academy - Environmental Land Use Restriction

("ELUR")

Soil remediation work undertaken by Goodwin College at 9 Riverside Drive (Connecticut River Academy) is almost complete. Working with DEEP, Goodwin College has "capped" certain areas of the property such that contaminated soils on the site are rendered inaccessible and left below the surface.

To finalize cleanup, Goodwin College must enter into an ELUR with the DEEP. This agreement will limit certain activities at the site, which might compromise the contaminated soil under the capped areas on the property. As part of this agreement, the Town is being asked to subordinate its sidewalk and drainage easements at the site to the terms of the ELUR. What this means is that maintenance work on the Town's structures within the capped areas would be allowed provided the cap is repaired and no contaminated soil is released. While this could make repairs more costly, it would not impact the Town. First, under our sidewalk easement, Goodwin College bears responsibility for all maintenance, repair and replacement of the sidewalks. Second, I have negotiated a provision in the Subordination Agreement that obligates Goodwin College to pay the increased cost of repairs and maintenance associated with the placement of the drainage structure in the area covered by the ELUR.

I ask that you request Chairman Kehoe to place this item on the Town Council agenda for action by the Town Council. I suggest that the Town Council consider the following motion:

Move: that the Town Council authorize the Mayor to execute the attached Subordination Agreement in which the Town of East Hartford subordinates its interests in sidewalk easements recorded in volume 3436, page 283 of the East Hartford Land Records, and Drainage Easement #3 recorded in volume 3436, Page 289 of the East Hartford Land Records, to the terms of an Environmental Land Use Restriction Agreement between Goodwin College and the Commissioner of Energy and Environmental Protection of the State of Connecticut, with respect to the property known as 9 Riverside Drive, East Hartford, CT.



### SUBORDINATION AGREEMENT

THIS SUBORDINATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made as of this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 2015, by TOWN OF EAST HARTFORD, a Connecticut municipal corporation, with an address at 740 Main Street, East Hartford, Connecticut ("East Hartford"), and GOODWIN COLLEGE, a Connecticut corporation with an address at 1 Riverside Drive, East Hartford, Connecticut ("Goodwin") in favor of THE COMMISSIONER OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION OF THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT, with a principal office at 79 Elm Street, Hartford, CT 06106-5127 ("DEEP").

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Goodwin is the owner in fee simple of all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situated in the Town of East Hartford, County of Hartford and State of Connecticut, described in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> attached hereto and made a part hereof, together with all the appurtenances thereto and the improvements thereon ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 22a-133o of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S."), as amended, Goodwin and the DEEP will enter into a Declaration of Environmental Land Use Restriction and Grant of Easement by and between Goodwin and the DEEP ("ELUR"), a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and made a part hereof and which shall be recorded in the Land Records; and

WHEREAS, East Hartford is the holder of certain drainage and sidewalk rights and interests in the Property ("East Hartford's Interests") pursuant to a certain Sidewalk Easement from Goodwin to East Hartford dated December 2, 2013, recorded in Volume 3436, Page 283 of the East Hartford Land Records [Sidewalk Easement 3 and Sidewalk Easement 4 as shown on Exhibit C to the ELUR]; and a certain Drainage Easement from Goodwin to East Hartford dated December 3, 2013, recorded in Volume 3436, Page 289 of the East Hartford Land Records [Drainage Easement 3 as shown on Exhibit C to the ELUR] (collectively, "Affected Easements"); and

WHEREAS, C.G.S. Section 22a-133o provides that Goodwin may not record the ELUR unless all holders of an interest in the Property irrevocably subordinate their interest to the ELUR; and

WHEREAS, East Hartford desires to enter into the following agreements with respect to the priority of East Hartford's Interests under the Affected Easements and DEEP's interest in the ELUR as they affect the Property.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) paid in hand by DEEP to East Hartford and other

good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legal bound, the parties hereto covenant and agree as follows:

- 1. East Hartford acknowledges that it has received and reviewed a copy of the ELUR attached hereto as **Exhibit B**; and
- 2. East Hartford consents, covenants and agrees that East Hartford's Interests under the Affected Easements may be made subject to and subordinate to the operation of the ELUR and to all renewals and extensions thereof; and
- 3. East Hartford, for any purpose as may be required pursuant to East Hartford's Interests under the Affected Easements, hereby consents and agrees to the terms of the ELUR and to the execution, delivery and recording of the ELUR; and
- 4. Goodwin College, in consideration of East Hartford's agreement to subordinate its rights under the Affected Easements to the ELUR, hereby agrees to indemnify and hold East Hartford harmless from all costs and loss associated with the increased cost of the repair and maintenance of the Drainage Easement attributable to the ELUR, including but not limited to increased costs associated with the repair or restoration of the ELUR area protective cap, the need to excavate within the ELUR area, or the restoration or removal of any contaminated soils.
- 5. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns.
- 6. This Agreement may not be supplemented, amended or modified unless set forth in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- 7. All notices, requests and other communications to any party hereunder shall be in writing and shall be given to such party at its address set forth above or such other address as such party may hereafter specify for the purpose by notice to the other parties hereto. Each such notice, request or other communication shall be effective:

  (i) if given by mail, 48 hours after such communication is deposited in the mails with first-class postage prepaid, addressed as aforesaid; or (ii) if given by any other means, when delivered at the address specified in this Section 6.
- 8. Any provision of this Agreement that is determined by a government body or court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unenforceable or illegal shall be ineffective only to the extent of such holding and shall not affect the validity, enforceability or legality of any other provision, nor shall such determination apply in any circumstance or to any party not controlled by such determination.
- 9. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which together constitute a fully executed agreement even though all signatures do not appear on the same document. The failure of any

party hereto to execute this Agreement, or any counterpart hereof, shall not relieve the other signatories from their respective obligations hereunder.

10. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of the State of Connecticut.

WHEREAS, the Grantee's written approval of this environmental land use restriction is contained in the document attached hereto as Exhibit B (the Decision Document) which is made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the property or portion thereof identified in the class A-2 survey (the "Subject Area") which survey is attached hereto as Exhibit C which is made a part hereof, contains pollutants; and

WHEREAS, to prevent exposure to or migration of such pollutants and to abate hazards to human health and the environment, and in accordance with the Decision Document, the Grantor desires to impose certain restrictions upon the use, occupancy, and activities of and at the Subject Area, and to grant this environmental land use restriction to the Grantee on the terms and conditions set forth below; and

WHEREAS, Grantor intends that such restrictions shall run with the land and be binding upon and enforceable against Grantor and Grantor's successors and assigns;

NOW, THEREFORE, Grantor agrees as follows:

- 1. Purpose. In accordance with the Decision Document, the purpose of this environmental land use restriction is to assure that the use and activity at the property and the Subject Area is restricted in accordance with the requirements of the Decision Document attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- 2. Restrictions Applicable to the Subject Area: In furtherance of the purposes of this environmental land use restriction, Grantor shall assure that use, occupancy, and activity of and at the Subject Area are restricted in accordance with the requirements of the Decision Document, attached hereto as Exhibit B. Such restrictions shall remain in effect unless and until a release is obtained under paragraph 5 below.
- 3. Except as provided in Paragraph 4 below, no action shall be taken, allowed, suffered, or omitted if such action or omission is reasonably likely to:
  - i. Create a risk of migration of pollutants or a potential hazard to human health or the environment; or
  - ii. Result in a disturbance of the structural integrity of any engineering controls designed or utilized at the Property to contain pollutants or limit human exposure to pollutants.
- 4. Emergencies. In the event of an emergency which presents a significant risk to human health or the environment, the application of Paragraphs 2 and 3 above may be suspended, provided such risk cannot be abated without suspending said Paragraphs and the Grantor:
  - i. Immediately notifies the Grantee of the emergency;
  - ii. Limits both the extent and duration of the suspension to the minimum reasonably necessary to adequately respond to the emergency;
  - iii. Implements all measures necessary to limit actual and potential present and future risk to human health and the environment resulting from such suspension; and
  - iv. After the emergency is abated, implements a plan approved in writing by the Grantee, on a schedule approved by the Grantee, to ensure that the Subject Area is remediated in accordance with R.C.S.A. sections 22a-133k-1 through 22a-133k-3, inclusive, or restored to its condition prior to such emergency.

- 5. Release of Restriction; Alterations of the Subject Area. Grantor shall not make, or allow or suffer to be made, any alteration of any kind in, to, or about any portion of the Subject Area inconsistent with this environmental land use restriction until a release has been approved by the Commissioner and such release is either recorded on the land records in the municipality where such parcel is located or the requirement to record such a release is waived by the Commissioner pursuant to section 22a-1330 of the General Statutes. The Grantee shall not approve any permanent release of the Property from the provisions of this environmental land use restriction unless the Grantor demonstrates to the Grantee's satisfaction that Grantor has remediated the Subject Area in accordance with R.C.S.A. sections 22a-133k-1 through 22a-133k-3, inclusive.
- 6. Grant of Easement to the Grantee. Grantor hereby grants and conveys to the Grantee, the Grantee's agents, contractors, and employees, and to any person performing pollution remediation activities under the direction thereof, a non-exclusive easement (the "Easement") over the Subject Area and over such other parts of the Property as are necessary for access to the Subject Area or for carrying out any actions to abate a threat to human health or the environment associated with the Subject Area. Pursuant to this Easement, the Grantee, the Grantee's agents, contractors, and employees, and any person performing pollution remediation activities under the direction thereof, may enter upon and inspect the Property and perform such investigations and actions as the Grantee deems necessary for any one or more of the following purposes:
  - i. Ensuring that use, occupancy, and activities of and at the Property are consistent with this environmental land use restriction;
  - ii. Ensuring that any remediation implemented complies with R.C.S.A. sections 22a-133k-1 through 22a-133k-3, inclusive;
  - iii. Performing any additional investigations or remediation necessary to protect human health and the environment:
  - iv. Ensuring the structural integrity of any engineering controls described in Exhibit B of this environmental land use restriction and Grant of Easement and their continuing effectiveness in containing pollutants and limiting human exposure to pollutants.
- 7. Notice and Time of Entry onto Property. Entry onto the Property by the Grantee pursuant to this Easement shall be upon reasonable notice and at reasonable times, provided that entry shall not be subject to these limitations if the Grantee determines that immediate entry is necessary to protect human health or the environment.
- 8. Notice to Lessees and Other Holders of Interests in the Property. Grantor, or any future holder of any interest in the property, shall cause any lease, grant, or other transfer of any interest in the Property to include a provision expressly requiring the lessee, grantee, or transferee to comply with this environmental land use restriction and Grant of Easement. The failure to include such provision shall not affect the validity or applicability to the Property of this environmental land use restriction and Grant of Easement.
- 9. Persons Entitled to Enforce Restrictions. The restrictions in this environmental land use restriction on use, occupancy, and activity of and at the Property shall be enforceable in accordance with section 22a-133p of the General Statutes.
- 10. Severability and Termination. If any court of competent jurisdiction determines that any provision of this environmental land use restriction or Grant of Easement is invalid or unenforceable, such

provision shall be deemed to have been modified automatically to conform to the requirements for validity and enforceability as determined by such court. In the event that the provision invalidated is of such nature that it cannot be so modified, the provision shall be deemed deleted from this instrument as though it had never been included herein. In either case, the remaining provisions of this instrument shall remain in full force and effect. Further, in either case, the Grantor shall submit a copy of this restriction and of the Judgment of the Court to the Grantee in accordance with R.C.S.A. section 22a-133q-1(1). This environmental land use restriction shall be terminated if the Grantee provides notification pursuant to R.C.S.A. section 22a-133q-1(1).

- 11. Binding Effect. All of the terms, covenants and conditions of this environmental land use restriction and grant of easement shall run with the land and shall be binding on the Grantor, the Grantor's successors and assigns, and each owner and any other party entitled to possession or use of the Property during such period of ownership or possession.
- 12. Terms Used Herein. The definitions of terms used herein shall be the same as the definitions contained in sections 22a-133k-1 and 22a-133q-1 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies as such sections existed on the date of execution of this environmental land use restriction.

# DRIVEWAY CURBCUT ORDINANCE (January 15, 2015)

Section 18-19 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of East Hartford is hereby repealed.

Section 18-26 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of East Hartford is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

- (a) No driveway shall be constructed beyond the property line into a sidewalk area or public way in the Town without first obtaining a permit from the Director of Public Works or his designee. Such driveway shall conform with lines, grades and specifications required by the Director of Public Works or his designee. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to reconstruction or repair of an existing driveway.
- (b) No permit shall be issued pursuant to this section unless the applicant for such permit has obtained all approvals from the Planning and Zoning Commission, Zoning Board of Appeals or Inland Wetlands Commission as required by law.
- (c) In determining whether to grant or deny such permit, the Director or his designee shall consider the application's compliance with the Town of East Hartford's Manual of Technical Design, sound engineering principles and public safety interests; provided that no residential property driveway shall exceed twenty feet in width unless the director or designee determines that such driveway will comply with sound engineering principles and is in the best public safety interests of the town including consideration of the impact of such driveway on neighboring property, public sidewalks and roadways. As used in this subsection, "residential property" shall mean any property used for a single family residential dwelling or multi-family residential dwelling not exceeding six units.
- (d) No permit shall be issued pursuant to this section unless: (1) the applicant submits a Certificate of Insurance, evidencing coverage by a Comprehensive General Liability (CGL) policy with a one million dollar per occurrence limit approved by the Finance Director or the director's designee. Such certificate shall name the Town of East Hartford as an additional insured against liability arising from the construction of such driveway; (2) such applicant signs a hold harmless agreement approved by the Corporation Counsel that will hold the Town of East Hartford harmless from any and all claims and demands for damages to property or injuries to persons arising out of the construction of such driveway and (3) such applicant pays the fee for such driveway permit as provided by the Town Council in the Schedule of Fees.

Attached please find the amusement permit application from The Hartford Marathon Foundation submitted by its Technical Director Josh Miller.

The applicant seeks to conduct a marathon, road races and outdoor musical entertainment with volunteers and several thousand spectators and runners on Saturday, October 10, 2015 from 7:30 AM – 1:30 PM, with music running between 9 AM and 1:30 PM.

Pursuant to Town Ordinance (TO) 5-3, a review of the application was completed by the Directors of the Fire, Health, Parks & Recreation, Public Works Departments and the Offices of the Corporation Counsel and Finance.

The **Risk Management Department** states the Marathon Foundation will need to provide a Certificate of Liability Insurance in the amount of one (1) million limits for general liability. They must also endorse the policy to add the Town of East Hartford, its officials, employees and volunteers, Riverfront Recapture and the MDC as additional insured. The policy will need to be reviewed and approved prior to the event.

The Office of Corporation Counsel states it has no issues with this application and that the applicant will need to sign a License Agreement with the Town prior to the event.

The Fire Department approves the application as submitted and states that the anticipated cost for the Department's services is \$3,900.00.

The Health Department approves the application as submitted and states there are no anticipated costs to the Department.

The Parks & Recreation Department approves the application as submitted and states there are no anticipated costs to the Department.

The **Public Works Department** recommends the application be approved with the following conditions:

 Applicant shall obtain approvals for any road closures from the appropriate jurisdiction.

- The applicant will coordinate the implementation of any road closures with the EHPD and the Department of Public Works.
- The CT DOT is planning several construction projects in the area of the "mix master" interchange and detours will be in place. Background traffic on Pitkin Street will increase as a result of the DOT's detours. The race course should be reviewed accordingly and revised if necessary.
- The anticipated cost to the Department for this event is \$8,500.00.

The **Police Department** conducted a review of the application and the following comments/recommendations are made:

- The Police Department can provide adequate police protection for the event. The sites are suitable for the outdoor amusement, the expected crowds are of moderate to large size, and the areas have sufficient parking available.
- There will be significant detours for several hours. Traffic on the adjacent streets can be maintained with a near-normal flow of traffic.
- Police manpower required for these events exceeds the Department's normal Patrol Complement and overtime hiring will be necessary. As an event that is not Town-sponsored, this expense will have to be borne by the applicant. The cost, based on last year's expense, is expected to be approximately \$32,200.00.
