From the January 6th Town Council meeting:

<u>Esther Clarke</u> inquired on the path that the town's brine machine takes on streets –whether it does both sides of the street or just one side. The Mayor believes that the brine machine does both sides of the street, but will check with Tim Bockus.

The brine truck has proven itself to be a valuable asset in our winter storm fighting operations. This tool allows us to pretreat roadway surfaces well in advance of oncoming storms mostly during normal workday hours when pavement temperatures are warmer, resulting in overtime avoidance. It also allows us to reduce our salt usage since the brine stays where we place it unlike solid salt which tends to scatter when placed and when subjected to higher traffic volumes. For the most part, the brine is placed bi-directionally requiring a pass in each direction on a road. There are some instances where the brine is placed at night or when traffic is minimal that certain roads can be treated with a single pass. The discharge nozzles are adjustable and allow for variations in the spray pattern. The brine truck does have its limitation however. Consideration must be given to roadway surface temperatures and storm configuration before the brine will be used. So far this season, we have not used the truck since neither of the two recent storms have warranted the use of the brine. The first storm occurred during leaf collection when the truck was fitted for leaf collection and the latest involved significant rainfall which would have diluted and washed the brine from the surface.


<u>Anita Morrison</u> says that she has received complaints about the LED street lights, especially in the Mayberry Village area, stating that peripheral lighting is diminished with the new lighting. *Mayor Leclerc will inform Tim Bockus and take a ride through the neighborhood. The Mayor also asked that Councillor Morrison get more details from the citizens as to what they perceive is different.*

The LED streetlights in the Mayberry Village area were installed during the first week of December. I have been through the area since their installation and noted a significant improvement to the lighting. I took especial note of the consistent coverage along the roadways with very little "dark spots" present which were prevalent with the previous high pressure sodium fixtures. Also, I was impressed with the color rendering of the new LED which allowed me to distinguish colors. For example, I could easily recognize a blue car from a green car or a silver car from a white car. I would like to emphasize that LEDs are highly directional and concentrate more of the light where it is intended. If there was a concern with diminished peripheral lighting, it could be that the light is now better kept to the roadway reducing

lost light, typical of the old high pressure sodium fixtures, onto front yards. More specific location information would be necessary to pursue the complaint.

Sec. 2-3. Mayor's Salary

Beginning November 14, 2007, the Mayor's salary shall be \$78,723, which is a zero increase and beginning on November 14, 2008, the Mayor's salary shall be \$81,400 which is an increase of 3.4%, representing the increase in the consumer price index for 2005. Beginning November 11, 2014 and annually thereafter, the Mayor's salary shall increase by fifty percent of the increase in the consumer price index-all urban consumers for the preceding calendar year, provided that the Mayor's salary for November 11, 2013 shall be increased by fifty percent of the consumer price index-all urban consumers for the calendar years 2006 through 2012 inclusive. Effective November 2015, the Mayor's salary will be \$90,067 which is based on the increase in the 2013 consumer price index. Effective November 2016, the Mayor's salary will be \$91,688 which is based on the increase in the 2014 consumer price index.

REGISTRAR OF VOTERS SALARY

(January 15, 2015)

Section 2-3b of the Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinances is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

Beginning on January 1, 2015, the salary for each registrar of voters shall be [\$21,750] \$23,000 [which is an increase of \$1,750 representing the increase in the consumer price index for calendar years 2009 through 2013.] and the salary for each of the deputy registrar of voters shall be \$8,000, provided: (1) the registrar of voters office shall be open to the public no less than twenty-four hours per week; (2) the registrar of voters and deputy registrar of voters shall conduct no less than four voter outreach session in locations outside of town hall annually; (3) the registrars of voters and deputy registrars of voters shall take state mandated training for such offices; (4) the registrar of voters and the deputy registrar of voters shall comply with all state election law requirements; and (5) the registrars of voters shall provide an annual written report to the mayor and town council within two months after each election which shall consist of an overview of the office's activities for the year, an appraisal of the conduct of voting process for the previous election including any primary or special elections and recommendations for improving the election process.

The Town Council may reduce the salary of a registrar of voters or a deputy registrar of voters if it determines that such person violated any provision of this section.

DRIVEWAY CURBCUT ORDINANCE (January 15, 2015)

Section 18-19 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of East Hartford is hereby repealed.

Section 18-26 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of East Hartford is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof:

- (a) No driveway shall be constructed beyond the property line into a sidewalk area or public way in the Town without first obtaining a permit from the Director of Public Works or his designee. Such driveway shall conform with lines, grades and specifications required by the Director of Public Works or his designee. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to reconstruction or repair of an existing driveway.
- (b) No permit shall be issued pursuant to this section unless the applicant for such permit has obtained all approvals from the Planning and Zoning Commission, Zoning Board of Appeals or Inland Wetlands Commission as required by law.
- (c) In determining whether to grant or deny such permit, the Director or his designee shall consider the application's compliance with the Town of East Hartford's Manual of Technical Design, sound engineering principles and public safety interests; provided that no residential property driveway shall exceed twenty feet in width unless the director or designee determines that such driveway will comply with sound engineering principles and is in the best public safety interests of the town including consideration of the impact of such driveway on neighboring property, public sidewalks and roadways. As used in this subsection, "residential property" shall mean any property used for a single family residential dwelling or multi-family residential dwelling not exceeding six units.
- (d) No permit shall be issued pursuant to this section unless: (1) the applicant submits a Certificate of Insurance, evidencing coverage by a Comprehensive General Liability (CGL) policy with a one million dollar per occurrence limit approved by the Finance Director or the director's designee. Such certificate shall name the Town of East Hartford as an additional insured against liability arising from the construction of such driveway; (2) such applicant signs a hold harmless agreement approved by the Corporation Counsel that will hold the Town of East Hartford harmless from any and all claims and demands for damages to property or injuries to persons arising out of the construction of such driveway and (3) such applicant pays the fee for such driveway permit as provided by the Town Council in the Schedule of Fees.
