OLD BUSINESS

Gold Star Essay Awards

The Gold Star Essay contest is an event in which high school seniors write biographies of veterans who are on the Gold Star Honor Roll. A winner is chosen and receives a plaque or citation in recognition of their achievement. The Commission had discussed presenting the winner of the contest with a monetary prize, but Corporation Counsel stated that nothing of any monetary value can be awarded. It was suggested that the Commission work with the local chapter of the VFW to award a scholarship to the winner.

Mr. Satalino will bring this idea to the VFW – of which he is a member – to discuss the concept of partnering with the Commission on this, and other veteran-related events, and the dollar amount that could be offered to the winner.

Procedural Rules – report from Commissioner Tsegai

At the February 27th meeting, Awet Tsegai said he would contact Sarah Morgan, Library Director, to inquire if the Commission could use the Raymond Library as their storage facility. As of this date, Mr. Tsegai has not heard from Ms. Morgan.

Budget Update

Melodie Wilson, Treasurer, reported that the Commission has approximately \$15,167 available and that the expenditures to date are \$487.76.

Flag Retirement - Review of Drop Boxes

Mr. Tsegai reported that Sarah Morgan, the Library Director, has agreed to the placement of a box at Raymond Library for the retirement of flags.

John Cook reported that the price of a pre-fab box which measures 18"x18"x3' is \$16.95 each.

Flag Placements –

Chair Cook announced that the price per gross for flags this year is \$101.00. The Commission would like to order 46 boxes.

representative) together with a member of the Military, another elected official, etc. No decision was made at this time.

East Hartford High School -

The Commission needs to apply for the use of the auditorium at the high school for the Memorial Day events. It was suggested that the Commission invite the EHFD and request a color guard for the activities.

- Howard Satalino and Melodie Wilson will inquire of clergy to give the convocation
- The Commission's newly formed Communications Subcommittee will invite Town Officials.

The Commission would also like a member of the clergy to give the convocation at the "reading of the names".

At this point, the Chair asked Mr. Satalino if he would consider being the VFW liaison to the Veterans Commission. He said he would think about it.
